- 3. Council may seek informal comments from the Local Traffic Committee before submitting the TMP.

- 5. Council advised of either RMS approval to the TMP or a need for more information. If the TMP is not approved Council has the right of appeal to the Minister for Roads.
- **6.** Following receipt of RMS approval to the TMP, Council can proceed in accordance with the requirements of the Delegation.
