

Introduction
Children's Cemetery | Byron Bay

Plummer & Smith have been engaged by Byron Shire Council to provide designs for the Children's section of the Byron Bay Cemetery.

The intent of this proposal is to design upgrades to the Children's section of the Cemetery that can provide a respectful and contemplative space.

The proposals follow on from an existing condition and analysis report produced for Byron Shire Council by the consultant 'Changing Places' that included recommendations to rejuvenate the Children's section of the Cemetery.

Recommendations included potentially removing the existing un-used brick niche wall and revitalising the Children's section.

Another key recommendation was the development of illustrative plans and perspectives for consultation purposes. The purpose of this document is to provide proposals for consultation and discussion with families.



Site Children's Cemetery | Byron Bay

The Children's section is situated in a small clearing on the western edge of the Byron Bay Cemetery. The Cemetery is largely made up of a series of clearings with open forest surrounds.

   Potential for planting and amenity improvements to the entry drive

This part of the cemetry has a sense of seclusion and quiet which is the result of existing vegetation that frames the edges of the space. The experience of light and sky within the clearing is a feature that the proposal seeks benefit from.



As outlined above the key condition, or experience, of the site is of a clearing open to the sky. The following pages propose revitalisation works to the site area that seek to capitalise on the key positive experiences of the space - a sense of quiet and protection that exists within a clearing in a forest. The space should allow people to be still and experience the natural environment around them:

- the movement of the sky across the top of the clearing
  the movement of the leaves and trees
- the activity and music of the birds across and around the clearing
- the movement of light- from deep shade to vivid sunlight














Current Conditions (graves)

#### BASIC DESIGN STRATEGIES

The basic design approach is to create a very simple and contemplative space- a space that provides visitors with the opportunity to stay and rest at the protected edges of the clearing

Seating and gathering area with — views across the clearing and the grave sites- locations that provide shade, prospect and views to the sky across the top of the canopy


Seat under the canopy of existing — tree- protected views across the space

Clearing zone

Area for existing and future grave sites

Simple axis through grave zone for access and management

Seating and gathering area with views across the clearing and the grave sites- space established under an existing tree to be retained

#### NOTES

- 1. Curved brick seating wall to the northern edge of the clearing- a contemplative space
  2. Seat with backrest under the
- canopy of an existing tree- a location that provides deep shade and protection. Minor under pruning required to lift canopy slightly
- 3. Mulched garden area under existing tree
- 4. Potential location for formal and/ or informal parking spaces
- 5. Existing tree to be retained6. Existing vegetation areas to be managed and rehabilitated
- 7. Proposed new tree on the axis of the grave sites
- 8. Proposed future expansion areas for grave sites
  9. Existing headstones of existing
- grave sites
- 10. Proposed 'garden' areas through grave zone- 'no-mow' grass or low maintenance low growing plants
- 11. Existing grass areas retained
- 12. Feature gathering space under existing tree- a small feature garden and gravel surface for gathering
- 13. Curveed brick or stone seating wall with views across the clearing from the sheltered and shaded edge of the space
- 14. Existing un-used brick niche wall to be removed
- 15. Existing access drive
