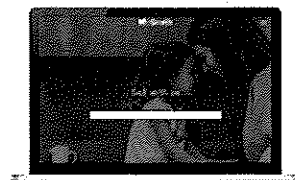

Hello Chris and Rebecca

The NSW Ambulance Service has requested Byron Shire Council to rename Granuaille Crescent as there has been a few life threatening instances of these emergency services attending the wrong address and eventually waking up the wrong people and wasting crucial time, before being redirected to the correct proximity.

A resident suggested Curtain Fig Crescent or Satinash Crescent but most residents said they didn't like these names and wanted to stick with Granuaille Crescent.

This is not going to happen as council must act responsibly and change the name so as to have no confusion with ALL emergency services.

See letter E2020/10338 above from the BSC dated 18th February, 2020.

Ellen LeHanne, whose actual driveway, letterbox and frontage is in Rankin Drive is asking other residents to support her attempt to have a larger sign and NOT rename.

Her second choice is one of councils suggestions which is Failte Crescent. Unfortunately, as with Granuaille Crescent, you have to spell this name everytime as it could be also spelt as Failyt and is not a common name.

If the residents aren't a bit altogether on this, then the BSC will pick a name of their choice out of the hat, and most people may not be happy.

See attached my "Letter to Residents" which I distributed yesterday. I will check with the residents soon to see if we have a common few preferred names.

I am asking you, as a landowner fronting Granuaille Crescent to support the majority of the residents wishes to the renaming.

I will come back to you in a day or two with the preferred and/or suggested names and ask for you to also make a submission.

We have recently had a visit from our neighbour, Mr Max Campbell, who lives at [REDACTED]. He has told us of his campaign to have Granuaille Crescent renamed (and renumbered) to avoid the confusion and potentially life-threatening issues that result from our and his houses having very similar addresses. We wholeheartedly support his proposal.

On three separate occasions we have been visited by paramedics and ambulance officers after Mr Campbell and his wife called 000. Luckily we surmised on the first occasion that that service was probably for [REDACTED] and were able to redirect the emergency service to that address. The ambulance officers had no idea where the address to which they had been called actually was.

Recently we had a knock on the door at around 5am by yet another ambulance officer enquiring as to our health. We redirected him. We fear for the safety of Mr Campbell and his wife if, on some future occasion, we are not at home when the ambulance officers come calling.

Clearly the naming of the roads is confusing. Renaming the Crescent is the solution to the problem.

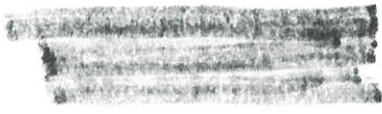

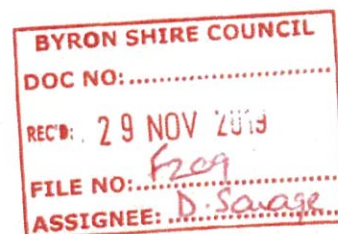

Dear Deanna,

I spoke to you back in 2018 about the renaming of Granuaille Crescent, Bangalow and now I find it necessary to respectfully request that this be revisited as there are a few pressing, life threatening issues that must be addressed.

#### BACKGROUND

Firstly, Thank you for re-naming the northern portion of Granuaille Crescent to Pioneer Crescent. I believe this was a brilliant idea and will save me many hours as an unpaid director, getting out on the road and explaining to drivers where 1, 1A or 1B Granuaille Crescent is.

Secondly, let me endorse the name Pioneer Crescent, as it is a very fitting name for that part of the road.

Thirdly, I would hope that council staff ensure that the numbering starts in the accepted way of starting at the town (Bangalow) end. I remember an irate furniture removalist van driver asked me where number 9 Granuaille Crescent was. He angrily informed me that I was [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] should be on the 'town' side, being closer toward town. Yes, he is correct.

Fourthly, I am sick of re-delivering letters to and from [REDACTED]. New post deliverers often do not look at the address properly and we receive each other's mail.

Fifthly, and most importantly, can we start the wheels turning for the renaming and renumbering of the southern end of Granuaille Crescent?

\* On three occasions in the past two years we have had the need to call 000 for an ambulance to our residence for my elderly father-in-law who lives with us. On both occasions the ambulance drivers could not find us and we had to send an adult onto Granuaille Road with a torch to wave down and direct them to our property. Some months later we needed an ambulance again, but knowing the delays that could result in the backward numbering we decided to transport him to Byron Hospital by car.

\* Last week my wife was in John Flynn Hospital having an urgent heart related operation. Then yesterday morning soon after 4:00am she was suffering from a suspected heart attack, being erratic heart-beat, low blood pressure and chest pain.

I called 000 and gave them precise instructions how to find [REDACTED]. Yes, it was unfortunate (for want of a better word) that they couldn't find us, even though after some time I put a torch out the front near the letter-box highlighting [REDACTED] (see photo). After some time they did then find us, but not after they woke, disturbed and annoyed the owners of 13 Granuaille Road. See copy of their letter attached.

So, I rest my case. If Australia Post, the courier delivery drivers and the Ambulance Service (not to mention the Rural or NSW Fire Service) cannot find us and Byron Shire Council refuses to rename Granuaille Crescent, then those in council who refuse this request must take responsibility for any future mishap due to this problem.

We have recently had a visit from our neighbour, Mr Max Campbell, who lives at [REDACTED]. He has told us of his campaign to have Granuaille Crescent renamed (and renumbered) to avoid the confusion and potentially life-threatening issues that result from our and his houses having very similar addresses. We wholeheartedly support his proposal.

On three separate occasions we have been visited by paramedics and ambulance officers after Mr Campbell and his wife called 000. Luckily we surmised on the first occasion that that service was probably for [REDACTED] and were able to redirect the emergency service to that address. The ambulance officers had no idea where the address to which they had been called actually was.

Recently we had a knock on the door at around 5am by yet another ambulance officer enquiring as to our health. We redirected him. We fear for the safety of Mr Campbell and his wife if, on some future occasion, we are not at home when the ambulance officers come calling.

Clearly the naming of the roads is confusing. Renaming the Crescent is the solution to the problem.
